The State Homemaker degree is the highest award achieved in the Future Homemakers of America. The requirements are strict and take a great deal of work on the part of each girl, both as an individual and as a chapter member. Besides hav-

ing first obtained the Junior and Chapter degrees, the girls must be active members in the FHA chapter and a student in home economics. In order to qualify for the State Homemaker degree, each girl must work toward individual goals, participate in chapter FHA activities, participate and support school functions, work on various community projects, and carry out both state and national projects.
