

Russell C. Shaud

JEROME - Judge Russell C. Shaud, 74, of Jerome, died Saturday, Dec. 11, 1993, in Yuma, Ariz.

He was born May 29, 1919, in Annville, Pa., the son of George and Stella Shaud. Russell received his education through high school in Annville.

He joined the U.S. Air Force in 1941, and served four years in the South Pacific. While visiting friends in Jerome, he met his wife, Betty Summer. They were married on Oct. 20, 1945. They resided in Carlisle, Pa., where he received his pre-law degree. After attending the University of Idaho in Moscow, where he received his L.L.B. degree, he began practicing law in Hazelton.

Russell continued his fulltime practice until 1957, when he was elected to teach U.S. Government and Business Law for five years at the Jerome High School. In the early 1960s, Russell returned to the legal profession as a justice of the peace and city judge for five years. From 1965 to 1971, he was appointed as a magistrate judge. He served 20 vears on the bench, retiring June 1, 1981. After retiring, he and his wife enjoyed traveling within the United States and abroad. For the last eight years, they have wintered in Yuma.
