**JEROME** — Services for Samuel Carl Worthington, 68, Jerome, who died early Tuesday at a Jerome hospital following a lengthy illness, will be conducted at 2 p.m. Thursday at the First Ward Chapel of the Jerome Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, with Bishop Neal Perkins officiating. Interment will be at Jerome.

Mr. Worthington was born May 5, 1902, at Goshen, Utah. He married Mary Deborah Hendry on Nov. 11, 1930, in Ontario. Their marriage was solemnized in 1932 in the Salt Lake City LDS Temple. He served a mission to Switzerland and Germany for two and one-half years and later graduated from the University of Idaho. He taught for two years in Riggins and moved to Jerome in 1941 where he taught chemistry and physics in the Jerome High School until his retirement two years ago. He had also operated the Highway Market for two years. He was an elder in the LDS church and had worked in the Sunday School, the MIA and sang in the choir. He was a member of the Jerome Lions Club, was a past president and had served as district governor of area 39W.

Survivors in addition to his wife include a son, Samuel Parker Worthington of Jerome; four sisters, Mrs. George (Carrie) Adams of Salt Lake City, Mrs. Gladys Taylor of Ogden, Mrs. Lylus Wasson of Boise, and Mrs. Erwin (Thelma) McPheters of Ketchum; several nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by two sisters and a brother.
